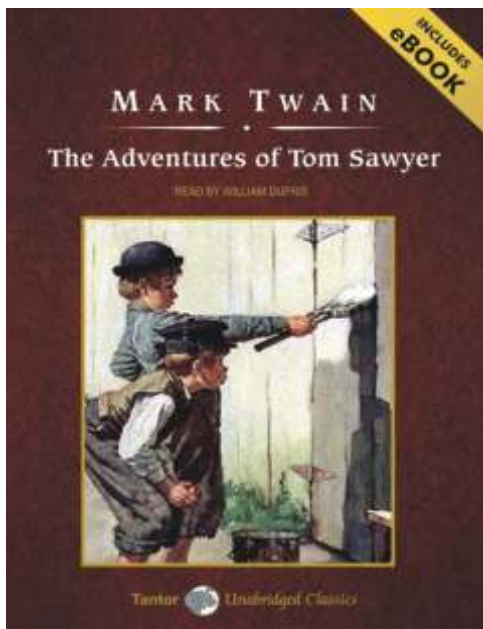

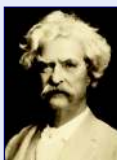

for realism of place and language, memorable characters, and hatred of hypocrisy and oppression.
